

# Care Guide Furniture



**A little care goes  
a long way.**



## Essential tips for protecting your noo.ma products.

### Please review them before first use.

- ✓ Avoid placing the furniture in direct sunlight or near a strong heat source to reduce changes.
  - ✓ Always remove stains quickly before they can cause any permanent damage to the furniture.
  - ✓ Avoid improper use such as putting your feet and standing on the table or sitting on the sideboards.
  - ✓ When moving your furniture, make sure to lift it to avoid damaging the floor, legs and mountings.
  - ✓ Be careful not to scratch or damage the surface with sharp objects.
  - ✓ Use protective mats under pots or hot objects.
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#### Wooden/Veneer parts

Wood is a natural material – all veins and small knots are part of its character. All wooden/veneer elements must only be cleaned using lukewarm water and a mild detergent like soap, then wiped dry.

Please keep in mind the following care tips to maintain the quality and appearance of veneer surfaces:

- Never place hot objects, such as tealights or pots, directly on the wooden surface: temperatures above 50°C may leave marks, cause cracking or the veneer to detach from its core.
- Veneered surfaces made from natural wood will naturally change in tone over time. These changes are accelerated by UV exposure and vary depending on its intensity.
- Avoid exposing veneered panels or elements to excessive moisture. Too much water can lead to swelling, delamination, and veneer cracking.
- Keep the surface away from solvents, ammonia, corrosive substances, and strongly staining liquids.

#### Fabrics

Most stains can be removed with water and a mild detergent like soap. Always dab gently — do not scratch or rub the material, and avoid spot cleaning individual marks, as this may cause damage or discoloration.

To keep your fabrics looking fresh, we recommend the following care:

- Vacuum occasionally using the upholstery nozzle to remove dust and prevent fluff and pilling.
- To avoid wrinkles, straighten the fabric with your hands from time to time.
- Soak up spilled liquids immediately using an absorbent napkin or cloth by dabbing gently toward the center of the stain.
- Use only neutral detergents when necessary. Avoid using harsh chemicals. A hairdryer can help prevent watermarks after cleaning.
- If the stain persists or is likely to leave a mark (e.g. red wine), consult a specialist cleaner.

## Glass

Our structured glass fronts can be cleaned using standard glass cleaning products or a mild detergent like soap and lukewarm water. Always dry the surface with a soft, clean cloth to avoid streaks or water spots. Do not scratch or damage the glass with hard, sharp, or pointed objects.

## Melaminated boards

When cleaning is required we recommend a soft, damp cloth and water. If a detergent is needed it should be a mild one like soap or washing-up liquid. Always avoid using detergents that contain alcohol and ammonia or ones that have an abrasive or bleaching effect. When using soap or washing-up liquid, wipe it clean with water and wipe dry immediately. This is to avoid water remaining on the surface.

## Powder coated steel elements

Our powder coated steel parts should be cleaned using water and a mild detergent, such as soap, and then wiped dry with a soft cloth.

Please note the following care recommendations:

- Clean only with gentle, non-abrasive cleaning agents.
- Avoid any contact with solvents, ammonia, corrosive substances, or strongly staining liquids, as they may damage the surface.
- Unless otherwise specified, powder coated steel products are not suitable for outdoor use.
